## Competitions Information

### Prepared Events

All prepared events must include written documentation, and a presentation. Written documents will be submitted to the judges at the beginning of the presentation and will be scored separately from the oral presentation and Q&A (50% for documentation and 50% for oral/visual presentation and Q&A).

### Categories for Prepared Events:

#### 1. Best Project

A presentation of an event, or service project hosted by your student council.

#### 2. Creative Marketing

A presentation about how one of your student council's best and most effective marketing campaigns.

#### 3. Public Relations

A presentation on what platforms your student council uses to communicate with your community via social media, website, bulletin board, or other

#### 4. Growth and Sustainability

This is a presentation about how your student council continues to foster a membership or other student leaders.

### On Demand Events

On Demand Events will be conducted individually and in small groups. Participants will be given a prompt, problem, situation or scenario to respond to in a requisite amount of time. Individual tasks will be scored based on the product that is submitted. Group tasks will be scored on the team dynamic during the problem-solving time (50%) and on the group's explanation of their solution and judge Q&A (50%).

## Categories for On Demand Events:

### 1. Speech

Participants will have to give a speech to a panel of judges on a unknown prompt and limited time to prepare

### 2. Writing

Participants will have to write an essay read by panel of judges on a unknown prompt having limited time to write the essay

### 3. Group Scenario

Groups of four students will have to give a presentation to a panel of judges on an unknown prompt with limited time to prepare.

## Artifacts

Artifacts are a physical project made prior to arriving at the WASC state conference. Each have there own unique rubric which they will be graded on.

### Artifact Categories:

#### 1. Standards of Excellence

Will be graded on the same rubric it has had in years past

#### 2. Digital Scrapbook

A collection of pictures from the accomplishments and events of a Student Council in the 2019-2020 school year on a digital presentation.

#### 3. T-shirt Design

A T-shirt produced by the student council with an original design

#### 4. Graphic Design

An original image created and used by the Student Council in a marketing campaign during the 2019-2020 school year

## Scoring

### Individual Event Awards:

Each competition will be scored individually based using the established rubric and schools will receive gold, silver and bronze ribbons based on their scores.

### Core Value Awards:

At the conclusion of all competitions, judges collectively will determine which schools to award for leadership, service, empowerment, and engagement. Schools that exemplify these values throughout the competition program will be awarded beyond the individual competition ribbons.

### Inspire Award:

Judges will determine an overall competition winner based each school performance in individual competitions and in their demonstration of the core values.
